

FMED 4107 – Sports Medicine

Medical Specific Course Types

Selective - Ambulatory Care
Medical Elective

Course Description

This 4-week outpatient Sports Medicine elective focuses on the evaluation of sports-related injuries, overuse injuries, and chronic debilitating orthopedic musculoskeletal conditions. Students will work and interact with Family Medicine/Sports Medicine faculty, musculoskeletal radiologists, orthopedic surgeons, and physical therapists as scheduled by the Family Medicine/Sports Medicine faculty. Students may observe, assist with, and perform under direct supervision diagnostic and therapeutic joint injections, trigger point injections, and splinting/casting. Students will also have the opportunity to work in an athletic training room setting and cover athletic events with supervisory faculty. This course is open to MS2-MS4 students who have successfully completed the Family Medicine core clerkship.

- 1.) Obtain approval from Course Director to register.
- 2.) Student must make sure they have access to EPIC prior to start of rotation.
