Mission: The LSOM Dean's Office is pleased to announce a call for nominations for the Master Research Award for Distinguished Mentor. This award was created to recognize a faculty member who has embodied the spirit of UT Health San Antonio's research mission by mentoring individuals at various stages of their academic research careers, especially junior faculty. <u>This award is designed to recognize</u> <u>excellence in research mentoring.</u> In that spirit, nominations must be made by a current or former mentee; self-nominations are not accepted for this award.

Description: The award will be given annually to one distinguished faculty member. The winner will receive a one-time monetary payroll distribution and receive a certificate conferred by the LSOM Dean during the annual LSOM Medical Faculty Assembly meeting as well as a nameplate affixed to the LSOM Master Research Award for Distinguished Mentor commemorative plaque.

Eligibility: Nominees must hold a primary faculty appointment to the Joe R. and Teresa Lozano Long School of Medicine and must be at the faculty rank of Associate Professor or above.

Criteria: The main criteria for this award is a demonstrable commitment to and proven effectiveness in research mentoring of junior faculty.

- Nominee's name, department and center/institute (if applicable), and faculty rank.
- Letter of nomination detailing how the nominee's research mentoring positively impacted the career trajectory of the nominator and what sets the nominee apart from other mentors.
- Nominee's CV including the nominee's mentoring activities and any mentoring awards received.
- Additional letters of support from current or former mentees or colleagues who have observed the nominee's mentoring. (minimum 2 additional letters, maximum 4)

Review Process and Criteria: Nominations will be evaluated by a panel of senior LSOM research faculty. The following criteria should be highlighted in the nomination:

- Demonstrable commitment to and proven effectiveness in research mentoring of junior faculty.
- Evidence of mentee career success.
- Diversity of mentees. Though the primary objective of this award is to recognize the nominee's mentoring of junior faculty, mentorship of other groups will be considered in the review.
