WHAT DO RESIDENTS DO IN CLINIC?

- Acute Care Rotation – “AC”
 - 3 Blocks During Intern Year; 1 block each in PGY-2 and PGY-3 years
 - One shared schedule
 - Same day visits: Acute issues/exacerbations, newborn well checks, telemedicine
- Continuity Clinic - “CHC”
 - One ½ day per week on average
 - Your own schedule
 - Well child checks (WCC), follow up of chronic issues
- Outpatient Curricula and Electives
 - Advocacy, Lactation, Global Health Track, Primary Care/Practice Management, Urgent Care, Complex Care

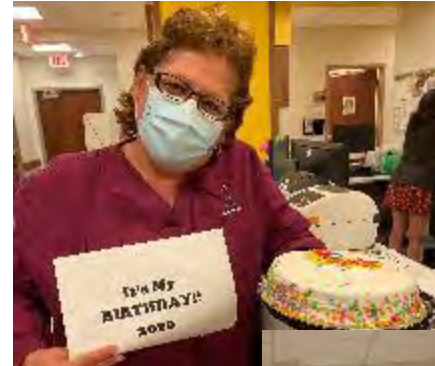


OUR PATIENTS
